
The initial training course will cover areas such child protection, sticking to boundaries and playing with children of all needs. The next course will start in late June 2011.

Citizens Advice Bureau

Advocacy Volunteers

Rethink requires new volunteers whose main duties may include: Using your own life skills or experience of services to support vulnerable adults to have choices and support in making their own decisions; accompanying vulnerable adults to access agencies and services that they would otherwise miss out on; finding out what services and opportunities are available locally; creating or contributing to a newsletter to share information within the area.; supporting the administration of the service; promoting the Service, Rethink and self advocacy skills such as assertiveness, within other services and with groups and individuals.

Different roles will require different skills/knowledge/experience and all volunteers must have a commitment to enabling vulnerable adults to have their say in what happens to them as well as the ability to listen effectively. In addition any of the following would be particularly helpful: personal experience of health or social care services; knowledge of the Calderdale area and the ability to listen effectively and to share information with others.

Activity and Community Development - volunteer in sport settings

Halifax Minster requires a School Trail Guide, the purpose of this role is to guide a group of primary school pupils (9-15 pupils plus staff) around a themed trail. The trail themes are currently 'Life in Victorian Halifax' and 'Monastic Life and the Reformation'. The guides job is to deliver most sections of the trail to pupils (a script will be provided). The guide will be in costume and may be expected to take on various roles in the different trails eg portraying a Victorian School teacher. Also required is a Volunteer "character", you will also be required to dress-up and deliver presentations to school groups whilst in character. For both roles you should have some experience of working with children and of performing, you should also have the ability to memorise a script.

Also required is a Sewing Volunteer. You will be needed to produce and maintain the costumes worn in the School Trail. You should have experience of using a sewing machine and reading simple patterns.

International Service - Youth volunteering overseas

The International Citizens Service scheme runs from June 2011 to spring 2012. You could be going to Brazil, Bolivia, Burkina Faso, Mali or the occupied Palestinian territory. They have worked in these countries for many years, and their experienced staff will ensure your safety and wellbeing. There are a wide range of projects, so whatever your passion or interest they should have something to suit you.

Volunteer placements last for 12 weeks. There are 170 places available and you won't have to go it alone. You'll be living and working in a small team, and a mentor will supervise and support you. All volunteers are given full training before they go on placement, and when they arrive in-country.

You must be aged between 18 and 22 years old, and living in the UK. If you do not have a British passport, you must have indefinite leave to remain in the UK, or be an EU/FEA citizen currently living in the UK.

You don't need specific qualifications, but personal qualities are important - like motivation, being willing to learn, and a commitment to helping others. We want to ensure that the scheme is open to everyone, regardless of their income. Placements are fully-funded for those on low incomes, but some volunteers will be expected to make a contribution towards the cost of their placement.

Opportunities for older volunteers

There are also 30 opportunities for volunteers aged 23+ to act as team leaders and specialist project co-ordinators.






Volunteer Fundraisers
